

Water Regulations/ Byelaws Training Manual

If you're a plumber wanting to work with your local water company, this course will give you the right qualifications. It cover the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999 (England and Wales) and the Water Byelaws 2004 (Scotland) and meet the requirements of WRAS (the Water Regulations Advisory Scheme) of which the majority of the UK water companies are members. There are two distinct manuals, one for England/Wales and one for Scotland, as some regulations differ north of the border.

The manual for England/Wales covers the Water Supply (Water Fittings) Regulations 1999, while the one for Scotland references the Water Byelaws 2004.

Both manuals consist of twelve modules, an introduction, a glossary and an introductory DVD. You'll start with intensive training in the 12 modules, followed by three assessments. There are no practical elements – all training is theoretical. Once you've passed all three assessments you'll gain the WRAS/BPEC Water Regulations/Byelaws certificate and competency card.

What do you need?

To take the course you simply need to have some knowledge of plumbing and the water industry.

Who's it for?

The course is for anyone requiring an understand of water regulations/water byelaws. In particular those wishing to become approved plumbers/contractors. Successful candidates are encouraged to join the WIAPS – the Water Industry's Approved Plumbers Scheme. This enables them to issue a certificate of completion to both the householder and the water company.
